GUIDELINES FOR AUTHORS

Papers based on theoretical/experiments/empirical research and experience should satisfy good quality research and must reflect the practical applicability/policy implications of the research.

MANUSCRIPT SUBMISSION

1) Manuscripts should follow IEEE or APA Style Manual. Manuscripts may be submitted in APA format but these will be converted into IEEE format for publication in Indian Journal of Computer Science.

2) The Manuscripts should be in MS-Word format.

3) Two or more referees review all contributions by following the double blind system - that is, with the author's name and credentials deleted, so that the reviewers don't know who is authoring the work. The review process takes three months and the status would be known after three months of submission of the article. It is mandatory to mention a valid email address with content submitted online. We will acknowledge the receipt of your paper by email and an article id will be issued to the corresponding author. Manuscripts will be acknowledged within one week of receipt. The author(s) should keep in mind that it would be mandatory to cite this id while sending a query about the paper submitted online.

4) Every manuscript should be labeled as being :

- A Research Paper
- A Review
- A Case Study
- A Book Review

5) First page of the manuscript should have details of authors: Name, designation, institute, IEEE Membership if any, email id, phone number, address.

6) In the paper title, capitalize the first letter of the first and last word and all nouns, pronouns, adjectives, verbs, adverbs, and subordinating conjunctions (*If, Because, That, Which*). Capitalize abbreviations that are otherwise lower case (i.e., use DC, not dc or Dc) except for unit abbreviations and acronyms. Articles (*a, an, the*), coordinating conjunctions (*and, but, for, or, nor*), and most short prepositions are lower case unless they are the first or last word. Prepositions of more than three letters (*Before, Through, With, Versus, Among, Under, Between, Without*.) should be capitalized. Example:

- Nonlinear Gain Coefficients in Semiconductor Lasers: Effects of Carrier Heating
- Self-Pulsation in an InGaN Laser Part I: Theory and Experiment *m1*

7) The Abstract

The abstract must be a concise yet comprehensive reflection of what is in your article. In particular:

- The abstract must be self-contained, without abbreviations, footnotes, or references. It should be a microcosm of the full article.
- The abstract must be between 150-250 words.
 - The abstract must be written as one paragraph, and should not contain displayed mathematical equations or tabular material.
 - The abstract should include three or four different keywords or phrases, as this will help readers to find papers.

8) Index Terms

All papers must contain Index Terms. These are keywords provided by the authors. Index Terms appear in bold type in the same style as the Abstract, in alphabetical order, and as a final paragraph of the Abstract section.

9) Nomenclature

Nomenclature lists (lists of symbols and definitions) generally follow the Abstract and Index Terms and precede the Introduction.

10) All first citations of figures and tables in the paper must be in numerical order.

11) Text Section Headings must follow style guidelines (IEEE/ APA).

12) *Reference and Acknowledgment headings* are unlike all other section headings in text. They are never enumerated. They are simply primary headings without labels.

13) References and citations should be complete in all respects in order to enable readers to look up the source materials and most importantly, to demonstrate that your paper is well - researched and gives credit to the author(s) of the source materials.

14) Contributors whose papers are accepted or rejected will be informed by email only. Manuscripts will be acknowledged within one week of receipt. Hence, it is mandatory to mention a valid email address with the submitted content.

15) WE WILL NOT ACCEPT HARD COPIES OF THE PAPERS. The paper has to be submitted in MS-Word format only. There is no charge for submitting papers for blind review or publication.

16) **Each manuscript must be accompanied with the following details of all the authors:**

- Scanned passport size photograph (white background and light coloured clothes)
- Biography
- Name and address of institute
- Designation
- Valid email id, Postal address and phone/mobile number

Sample Biography of Authors

First A. Author (M'76–SM'81–F'87) and the other authors may include biographies at the end of regular papers. Biographies are often not included in conference-related papers. This author became a Member (M) of IEEE in 1976, a Senior Member (SM) in 1981, and a Fellow (F) in 1987. The first paragraph may contain a place and/or date of birth (list place, then date). Next, the author's educational background is listed. The degrees should be listed with type of degree in what field, which institution, city, state, and country, and year degree was earned. The author's major field of study should be lower-cased.

The second paragraph uses the pronoun of the person (he or she) and not the author's last name. It lists military and work experience, including summer and fellowship jobs. Job titles are capitalized. The current job must have a location; previous positions may be listed without one. Information concerning previous publications may be included. Try not to list more than three books or published articles. The format for listing publishers of a book within the biography is: title of book (city, state: publisher name, year) similar to a reference. Current and previous research interests end the paragraph.

The third paragraph begins with the author's title and last name (e.g., Dr. Smith, Prof. Jones, Mr. Kajor, Ms. Hunter). List any memberships in professional societies other than the IEEE. Finally, list any awards and work for IEEE committees and publications. If a photograph is provided, the biography will be indented around it. The photograph is placed at the top left of the biography. Personal hobbies will be deleted from the biography.
